

**County of Muskegon Public Notice of Sewer Use Ordinance
(SUO)**

AMENDATORY LANGUAGE TO THE
MUSKEGON COUNTY WASTEWATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM
SEWER USE ORDINANCE
“AN ORDINANCE TO CONTROL AND REGULATE DISCHARGES”
Revision #4: Dated April 1, 2013

The Muskegon County Wastewater Management System (MCWMS) and the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) are conducting this joint public notice in accordance with Michigan Administrative Code (MAC) R323.2308. MCWMS has submitted a request to modify its previously approved SUO. The requested modification includes revisions to Section 2.4 Local Limits to update the Chromium Maximum Allowable Industrial Loading and introduce language to allow a six month rolling Biochemical Oxygen Demand averaging limit. The MDEQ has reviewed the request and determined that it is a substantial program modification as defined in the MAC R 323.2309. The proposed SUO and a companion document, Discharge Limits and Allocation Procedures of Muskegon County, may be viewed online at www.muskegoncountlywastewatertreatment.com. Comments or objections to the proposed request for the MCWMS to implement these changes to its SUO, which are received within 30 days, will be considered in the final decision. If no substantive comments are received, no further notice will occur. The request for a hearing should list the reasons why a hearing is being requested, identify the relevant issues, and identify specifically which portions of the proposed SUO changes are of concern.
